Preparation for Worship

Our worship begins with the prelude. The prelude invites us to prepare our hearts and minds for worship. We invite you to separate yourselves from the clutter of everyday life and focus on God through prayerful meditation.

What does this look like?

- Close your eyes and take some deep breaths.
- Meditate upon the scripture lessons for today, listed in the bulletin.
- Read the "Before worship" prayer located in the front of the hymnal.
- Silence your phone and silence your mind.
- Once the prelude begins, usually five minutes before the service, please refrain from loud conversation. The sanctuary, where the pews are, is a place of worship. While you are encouraged to welcome your brothers and sisters in Christ, we ask that you speak softly so as not to interrupt those who are taking this time to focus on God through the music presented.

Preparing for the Lord's Supper

All who receive the Lord's Supper at this church—members and guests alike—are encouraged to use the following questions as a guide to self-examination in preparation for Communion:

† "Am I a baptized child of the Heavenly Father?"

Acts 2:38-39. Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself."

- + "Have I confessed and repented of my sins?" Matthew 3:2. "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
- † "Do I trust that Jesus Christ alone is my Savior from sin?"

1 John 1:7. But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. * "Do I believe that in this Blessed Sacrament (Holy Communion) I am receiving the actual body and blood of Christ, under the bread and wine, for the forgiveness of my sins?" Matthew 26:26-28. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

† "Do I intend, with the Lord's help, to amend my sinful life?"

Galatians 5:22-25. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

If, in good conscience, you are unable to affirm the above questions, we invite you to come forward for a blessing. Simply cross your arms in front of you and the pastor or lay minister will offer a blessing to you.

Manuel Lutheran School

The wonderful world of Middle School science...

Our 6th through 8th graders have been immersed in the fascinating world of ecosystems and biomes.

Students began by learning about ecosystems, including the essential roles of biotic (living) and abiotic (non-living) factors. They explored how these factors interact to create environments, from lush rainforests to arid deserts. Diving deeper, they examined the unique adaptations that animals develop to survive in their specific biomes. Whether it's the long neck of a giraffe to reach high foliage or the ability of certain reptiles to blend into their surroundings, students marveled at how animals are intricately connected to their environments.

To put their knowledge of adaptations into practice, the students participated in a creative project called "Camouflaging Tom the Turkey." Each student designed a habitat for Tom and used art to create camouflage that would help Tom blend seamlessly into his surroundings. This activity reinforced the concept of animal adaptations and the importance of blending in as a survival strategy. If you have time, it is out on the table in the narthex. Next, the students will be diving into a hands-on lab to discover which types of bird beaks are best suited for specific diets. Using tools to simulate different beak shapes, students are testing how well various "beaks" pick up "food" items like seeds, grains, and nectar. This activity demonstrates the direct relationship between an animal's physical features and its role in the ecosystem. It's a fun and interactive way for them to understand natural selection and specialization in species.

This unit not only aligns with science standards but also builds critical thinking and problem-solving skills. By studying real-world examples and applying what they learn in engaging activities, our students are gaining a deeper appreciation for the beauty and complexity of the natural world.

Thank you for your continued support as we foster a love for learning and exploration in our school.
