Preparation for Worship

Our worship begins with the prelude. The prelude invites us to prepare our hearts and minds for worship. We invite you to separate yourselves from the clutter of everyday life and focus on God through prayerful meditation.

What does this look like?

- Close your eyes and take some deep breaths.
- Meditate upon the scripture lessons for today, listed in the bulletin.
- Read the "Before worship" prayer located in the front of the hymnal.
- Silence your phone and silence your mind.

Once the prelude begins, usually five minutes before the service, please refrain from loud conversation. The sanctuary, where the pews are, is a place of worship. While you are encouraged to welcome your brothers and sisters in Christ, we ask that you speak softly so as not to interrupt those who are taking this time to focus on God through the music presented.

Our worship today will be livestreamed for those members and friends that are unable to join us in person. By entering the Sanctuary, you give permission to Immanuel Lutheran Church and School to film or photograph you, and any minor children under the age of 18, and use your likeness on our social media channels and website.

Preparing for the Lord's Supper

All who receive the Lord's Supper at this church—members and guests alike—are encouraged to use the following questions as a guide to self-examination in preparation for Communion:

† **"Am I a baptized child of the Heavenly Father?"**

Acts 2:38-39. Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself."

† **"Have I confessed and repented of my sins?"**

Matthew 3:2. "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

† **"Do I trust that Jesus Christ alone is my Savior from sin?"**

1 John 1:7. But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

† **"Do I believe that in this Blessed Sacrament (Holy Communion) I am receiving the actual body and blood of Christ, under the bread and wine, for the forgiveness of my sins?"**

Matthew 26:26-28. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

† **"Do I intend, with the Lord's help, to amend my sinful life?"**

Galatians 5:22-25. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

If, in good conscience, you are unable to affirm the above questions, we invite you to come forward for a blessing. Simply cross your arms in front of you and the pastor or lay minister will offer a blessing to you.

Offerings are given as a response of all God's gifts given to us.







The halls are alive with the sounds of music!

As we approach the midpoint of this school year, we are learning new songs to sing in chapel, echo songs, and even using different instruments to sing God's song and the various folk songs handed down through the ages, which will aid us in learning to sing God's song, which He has inscribed upon each of us at our baptism.

Among the highlights of our year so far: singing with sign language at the Rally Day Service, a special visitor to our chapel service in the form of traveling LCMS musician WendySue Fluegge, and proclaiming the birth of Christ in our yearly Advent Service.

As we returned from the Christmas recess, we celebrated the coming of the Wise Men by singing "We Three Kings of Orient Are" during music class (thanks Ms. Diane!) and in chapel as Pastor Ryan explained the significance of the gifts in the song.

As we look towards the second half of the year, we look towards adding on to what we know with even more anticipation! As we are now in the season of Epiphany, the next thing for us to take on: Lutheran Schools Week. The songs we learn during this season will be a part of weekly chapel and during the Divine Service on February 2nd as we wrap up National Lutheran Schools Week (is it that time again already?).

Most of our classes have already sung in Sunday worship aside from Rally Day. PreK, Kindergarten, and First Grade sang "Seek Ye First" and Grades Two – Five learned a spiritual called "My Lord, What a Morning."

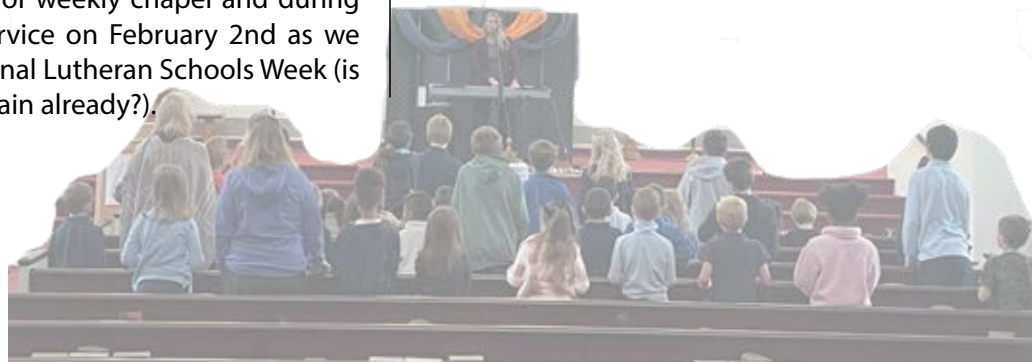
In the meantime, we continue to explore the basics of music theory in class weekly. Students in PreK up through Second Grade have been learning folk songs that they can both sing and act out. Songs like "Wise Old Owl" and "Cowboy Joe" really get them excited to participate.

Grades Three through Eight have been working on basic rhythm notation (quarter notes, eighth notes, and even sixteenth notes) while using various instruments to play these rhythms and writing them on the music staff.

All of this, of course, in service to adding to our ability to sing God's song for His glory and the edification of God's people!
